Future demand

- Survey design decisions are led by the research community
- ESRC's role is to ensure resources are committed appropriately and deliver value to the public
- Evidence so far demonstrates an ongoing need for interviewers to play an active part in:
 - Recruiting new samples
 - Contacting more reluctant participants
 - Collecting complex and/or sensitive data
- Need to understand the benefits of moving data collection online and the risks of reducing the role of interviewers
- ESRC has the advantage of being in a position to manage risks across its portfolio of studies



Current concerns

- Data quality
 - Need to demonstrate that studies are still scientifically valid
 - Do we have the metrics we need for this?
- Inclusivity
 - Need to demonstrate that studies represent all communities of interest
 - Have population surveys ever managed to do this?
- Cost pressures
 - Need to demonstrate that studies still deliver value for money
 - How high can data collection costs go before they are unaffordable?
