NCDS Age 62 Survey and BCS70 Age 50 Survey

- Major F2F surveys
- NCDS launched January 2020 paused March 2020
- BCS70 due to launch June 2020 delayed
- Many challenges to moving to web / telephone so we opted to trial video.



Why video?

- Increased familiarity of video-calling since lockdown
- No need for major re-programming
- Human interaction retained
- Minimal impact on measurement?
- Could work nicely in tandem with F2F (when feasible)



Video interviewing so far....

	NCDS Age 62 Survey	BCS70 Age 50 Survey
Feasibility test (skewed sample)		Issued sample = 60 October 2020
Larger scale pilot with representative sample	Issued sample – 310 June 2021	
Soft launch at larger scale		Issued sample = 1,067 July 2021
Main stage fieldwork launched	November 2021	November 2021



Approach

- Interviews conducted using MS Teams
- Small pool of specialised interviewers
- All contact remote telephone and email
- Adaptations:
 - Visual material presented via screen-sharing (showcards, leaflets)
 - Sensitive' questions self-completion web survey
 - Supplementary paper questionnaires are sent/returned by post

Paper self completion returned	93%	87%	94%	87%
Health records data linkage consent	65%	72%	-	60%
Agree to nurse visit	95%	97%	-	-

Adjustment to sensitive self-completion protocol: Adding screen-sharing

	NCDS Age 62 Survey – Main stage	BCS70 Age 50 Survey – Main stage
Web-survey completed by respondent during interview	62%	65%
Screen-sharing during interview	<mark>16%</mark>	<mark>12%</mark>
Web survey completed after interview	19%	13%
Total	97%	90%
Willing to complete after interview – not yet done	1%	5%

Impact on data quality – Item Non Response

	Age 50 (Video)	Previous sweep (F2F)
Gross pay – Item NR	4%	2%
Weight – Item NR	6%	2%
Value of home	2%	9%
Outstanding mortgage	4%	10%

Positive feedback from participants

- Break offs very rare only 2 across NCDS and BCS70 so far
- Almost all participants willing to do video interview again (97% NCDS, 99% BCS70)



Moving forward

- For longitudinal studies video interviews show some promise
 - Contact details held
 - Participants more willing
- Next waves of NCDS and BCS70 launching Feb Video
- Launch F2F in April (?) with video as back-up
- How many will choose video?
- Potentially a cost-effective approach to reach remote areas



More research needed on impacts on measurement and data quality
